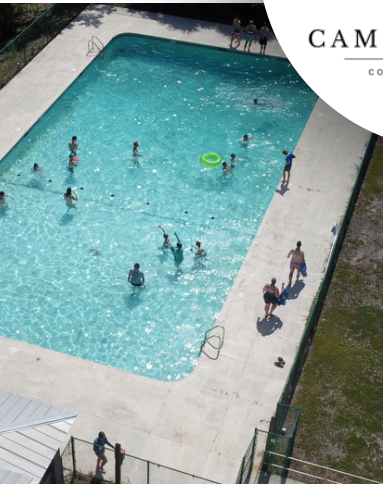

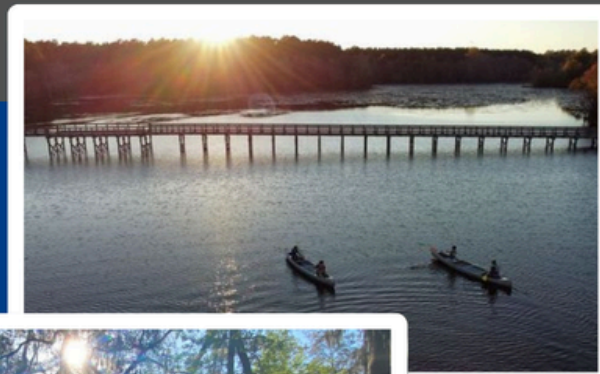


LOOKING FOR A PLACE TO CAMP?

TWO GREAT PROPERTIES

Our camps are always open for unit outings! Bring your Pack, Troop, or Crew for a weekend at either of our council camps.

Camping is just \$3 per person per night for in-council units. Camp for two nights and do a service project, approved by the ranger, and get the second night free!

\$10 per boat per day, plus a \$50 trailer rental. Three trailers are available that hold either 6 or 8. Paddles and PFDs included.

EX: Take a trailer of 6 for \$110

READY FOR ADVENTURE?

Schedule a float on the Savannah River

14 people or less, canoe or kayak, \$14 per person. That's drop off and pick up for an 8-mile float. (Which meets the requirements for the camping merit badge.)

We can accommodate different routes and larger groups, reach out to Jacob.

SCHEDULE A DAY AT THE RANGE

Bring your unit out for a day of Range and Target Activities

Archery: \$75 an hour (includes everything)

Rifle: \$75 an hour (does not include ammo, call for pricing or bring your own)

Shotgun: \$75 an hour (does not include ammo, call for pricing or bring your own)

We can accommodate open shooting or work on a merit badge.

Need a counselor? We can help with that too.

Zip Line : \$100 an hour

Climbing : \$100 an hour
